An excursion program to support Stage 2 History

'First Contacts' is a History site study focusing on the first contacts between Gadigal Aboriginal people and European colonists. Students will visit Barangaroo Reserve, Parbury Ruins and the Rocks Discovery Museum, to learn about

traditional Aboriginal culture and early European colonial settlement.

The program supports the key inquiry questions of 'What was life like for Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander people before the arrival of the Europeans?' and 'What was the nature and consequence of contact between Aboriginal people and early traders, explorers and settlers?'
