

Living World

An incursion program to support Stage 2 Science

Living World is an approx. 1.5 hr science incursion focussing on classification, life cycles and the survival of living things. Key inquiry questions covered include 'How can we group living things', 'What are the similarities and differences between living things' and 'How are environments and living things interdependent'.

The program supports the Living World topic, and uses literacy, numeracy, outdoor experiences and ICT to extend and enrich classroom learning. Students will take part in science based activities in their classroom, (and in school grounds), in order to collect data and information about living things, their external features, and how they are different to non-living things.
