The Rocks, People, Places and Events, supports 'The Australian Colonies' content of the Stage 3 History syllabus and the key enquiry questions of "What do we know about the lives of people in Australia's colonial past and how do we know? and, 'What were the significant events and who were the significant people that shaped Australian colonies?'

Students will visit various sites in The Rocks that are used to focus attention on colonial people, places and events during the 1800's. The program takes the form of an engaging mystery hunt for clues about important people, places and events that shaped Australia's identity during the colonial period. Students will work in supervised teams and use Centre iPads to create a site study journal of their investigations.
