Changing Places – S5 A program to support S5 Geography

'Changing Places' is a Geography fieldwork program focusing on the Key Inquiry Question of: "What strategies are used to manage environmental change in urban places to enhance sustainability?"

Students will use fieldwork sites in Barangaroo and Millers Point to:

- Learn about implications of Australia's projected population for the future growth and sustainability of places;
- Assess strategies to create economically, socially and environmentally sustainable urban places; and
- Describe ways for individuals and communities to contribute to a sustainable future.

Integrating the '*Sustainability'* cross curriculum priority is a feature of the program.

The program has three main components:

- 1. Comprehensive introductory activities and web based resources.
- 2. A full day fieldwork excursion at Barangaroo and Millers Point.
- 3. Follow up activities to enhance Geographic and Sustainability knowledge, skills, values and attitudes.



During the full day fieldwork excursion, students will:

Tour Barangaroo South to assess economic, social and environmental sustainability outcomes;

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- Complete fieldwork activities including mapping, field sketching and colling data on a fieldwork app to create a virtual map;
- Undertake a basic Environmental Impact Study of a proposed development;
- learn about a social sustoinability issue that has effectd the Millers Point community; and
- Observe the impacts of gentrification in Millers Point.

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The program supports the S5 Geography Syllabus *'Changing Places'* topic including:

- Assess management strategies for places and environments for their sustainability;
- Acquire and process geographical information by selecting and using appropriate and relevant geographic tools for inquiry; and
- Communicate geographical information to a range of audiences using a variety of strategies.
